SPECIAL CONDITION: MS State Law requires that male applicants between the ages of eighteen (18) and twenty-six (26) submit satisfactory documentation of their compliance with the draft registration requirements of the Military Selective Service Act with application. In addition, males between the ages of eighteen (18) and twenty-six (26) who are currently employed shall not be promoted to higher positions until they submit documentation of compliance with the requirements of the Federal Selective Service Act.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

1. High school diploma or GED equivalent. Completion of a Military Service School in aircraft maintenance or completion and certification in Airframes and Powerplants is desired.
2. Must possess a valid state driver's license and if authorized to operate a Government Vehicle, have the ability to obtain and maintain a US Government Motor Vehicle Operator's ID card. **PROOF OF DRIVER'S LICENSE MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH APPLICATION.**
3. Physical condition of such nature as to permit continuous, moderate to heavy work involving lifting, climbing, stooping bending, stretching and work in tiring and uncomfortable positions. Lifting equipment weighing 20-50+ lbs.
4. Paint and Spray Techniques preferred.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: (Not all inclusive, will be fully explained during interview)

1. Determines methods, techniques, and materials best suited for painting of all types of fixed and rotary wing aircraft and components.
2. Prepares Army aircraft and components for painting by removing old paint, utilizing paint remover, aluminum wool, scraping and other approved methods. Uses electric disc sander or other approved means to prepare surface for painting. Masks all glass, plastic, chrome, or other areas on which paint is not to be applied.
3. Uses spray gun to apply lacquers, enamels, primers, synthetic enamels, and gloss finish paints as prescribed by technical bulletins and special job requirements. Touches up inaccessible spots with hand brush. Assures that finish meets specified thickness requirement. Mixes into the paint a variety of catalysts and retardants.
4. Cuts stencils by hand with knife or shears or with a stamp cutout machine. Responsible for proper care and storage of brushes, paints and other materials and equipment used. Pays strict adherence to safety and fire regulations pertinent to paint and spraying operations.
5. May spend up to 20 percent of the time performing on-the-job training. Evaluates training effectiveness. Participates in conducting the necessary safety program for the paint shop.
6. Performs such travel as may be required in the accomplishment of assigned duties and the organizational mission.
7. May assist authorized firefighters in the performance of fire/crash rescue duties on an as needed basis.
8. Performs other duties as required.
