



MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD COMMAND SERGEANT MAJOR JONATHAN B. COLEMAN LAND FORCES COMPONENT, MISSISSIPPI

Command Sergeant Major Jonathan B. Coleman, Land Forces Component Command Sergeant Major, Mississippi National Guard, is a native of Fulton, Mississippi. He entered the U.S. Army in June 1991 where he completed One Station Unit Training (OSUT) at Fort Benning, Georgia, receiving his primary military occupational specialty (MOS) as an infantryman and mortarman. He is a graduate of Itawamba Community College with an associate's degree in liberal arts.
