Chief Lindsey began his military career nearly 24 years ago with the 1-198th Armor Battalion in Amory, MS. In 2003, he was selected for the Active Guard and Reserve program, where he served as a supply sergeant at Nettleton, MS. In 2004, he was deployed to Operation Iraqi Freedom III to An Najaf, Iraq, serving in logistics and combat arms roles. In 2006, he was selected Noncommissioned Officer of the Year, where

he won at the state, region, and 1st Army, and he competed in the Army-wide top seven Noncommissioned Officer of the Year. In 2007, as a Staff Sergeant, he went to Warrant Officer Candidate School. He is a Demonstrated Master Logistician with the International Society of Logistics and a Universal Certified HVAC Technician.

His military schools and training are an extensive list complementary to that of a Senior Warrant Officer but include all levels of Warrant Officer professional military training culminating with the Senior Service College. He is an honor graduate of the Command General Officer Staff Course and the Red Team Leaders Course. His military awards and declarations include the Bronze Star Medal, two Meritorious Service Medals, six Army Commendation Medals, five Army Achievement Medals, Humanitarian Service Medal, Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, Combat Action Badge, Norwegian Foot March badge, and several other federal and state awards. He also received the 2007 Sonny Montgomery Leadership Award, the 2010 Warrant Officer of the Year, and the Honorable Order of Saint Martain.
